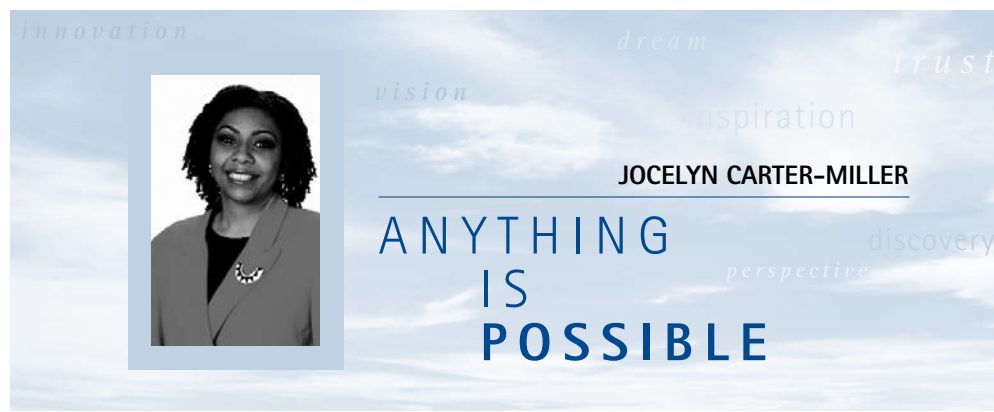

How many negative thoughts and self-doubts can fit on the head of a pin? Because that's about how much room there is in Jocelyn Carter-Miller's head for that kind of thinking. In the course of her career, Carter-Miller, '79 accountancy, has saved Barbie, helped establish Motorola in Latin America, and is now helping disadvantaged students excel in school and envision a better future for themselves.

"Anything is possible if you follow your dreams," says Carter-Miller.

Even as a young woman, Carter-Miller, a National Merit Scholar, dreamed of making the world a better place. A biology honors major when she first came to the University of Illinois, her original plan was to fix the world through science and genetics. But in 1972, when the government declared a moratorium on genetic research funding, she re-considered her options. Her biology adviser imagined that funding sources would shift from the government to business. And, he noted, if businesses were doing more funding, it would behoove Carter-Miller to learn a bit about the business world.

"If you want to do this, you have to be able to speak that language as well," he said.

So Carter-Miller stumbled into accounting, primarily because it fit her schedule best. However, having taken a few business classes, Carter-Miller concluded that perhaps business would, ultimately, be a better tool for changing the world than biology. So, as a junior, she adjusted her life plan and switched to a business major.

"By the time I was 30, I planned to be married, produce three children and have an amazing

career," she remembers. "As a CPA, I intended to join an accounting firm and rise to the level of manager within five years. I would then quit and have children while getting an MBA. Later, I would become a senior executive in a Fortune 500 company that not only made wonderful products and was a leader in its field, but also cared about its customers, employees, and community."

There was only one glitch in this plan. Carter-Miller had expected it to keep her busy for the next 40 years, at which point she'd retire. The glitch? It only took about 20 years. Her record of success and achievement is due in part to Carter-Miller's enormous energy, and in part to her ability to quickly assess a situation and come up with solutions that are at once brilliant and simple.

Take her Barbie campaign. After earning her MBA at the University of Chicago in 1981, Carter-Miller joined the consulting firm, Booz Allen Hamilton in New York, where she stayed two years. She then took a position at Mattel, Inc., as a manager of strategic business planning and later as product manager. She was assigned, among other things, the Barbie line, which has been the largest brand in the toy industry since 1959 when it was introduced. However, the year before Carter-Miller arrived on the scene, Cabbage Patch Dolls were introduced and Barbie's sales dropped for the first time ever.

For her part, Carter-Miller was thrilled to work on the Barbie brand.

"I loved Barbie; I grew up with her," says Carter-Miller. "To work on Barbie was creative and fun, and from the business aspect it was a great challenge."

Carter-Miller came at the problem both analytically and with guns blazing. A single solution or approach was simply not enough for her.

“I was an MBA, I had been a scientist, and a consultant,” she says. “So we did a lot of research and developed a strategy. I had a great young team working with me.”

The “Barbie Dream Team” that Carter-Miller led studied the changing demographics and psychographics of young girls and their mothers. This caused them to create several multicultural Barbies—including a line of black and Hispanic dolls—and career dolls. They also realized that for women who grew up with Barbie, there was a market in collector Barbies and designer Barbies; the first designer Barbie wore clothes created by Bob Mackie. They even took Barbie’s evening gowns and made them cocktail dresses to reflect changing fashions and younger consumers. Recognizing also that the largest margin was in clothes, the team rethought Barbie’s fashion line. To encourage fashion sales, they sold Barbie with no clothes (well, underwear, and a protective screen so no one could see her undies) at the original 1959 introduction price. Profit margins for Barbie increased 51 percent. The team also introduced entertainment with Barbie, including a Paula Abdul video.

“Now everyone has a television series or a record or a video, but at that time it was unheard of,” says Carter-Miller.

This brand strategy helped earn Carter-Miller and her team the AMA “Effie” award for the “I’m into Barbie” advertising campaign. She did equally astounding work with male action figures.

But prior to these accolades there came some serious nail biting. Two weeks before the new Barbie line was going to be unveiled for the major toy stores, from Target to FAO Schwarz to Toys R Us, Carter-Miller’s team showed the line to their senior sales staff.

“They looked at the line and said, ‘This is the worst line we’ve ever seen. We cannot sell this, they must be crazy,’” remembers Carter-Miller.

The president of Mattel called her in to his office and demanded that she rethink the entire line. But, after talking with her team they decided not to change anything.

“We had researched it, we had put our heart and souls into it, and we didn’t have large mortgages or kids in college. We were not going to change anything,” says Carter-Miller.

When Toys R Us buyers came two weeks later, Carter-Miller and her team presented the line. At first there was silence, then the CEO stood up and said that this was the best line he’d ever seen and they were going to double their orders. She and her whole team were heroes. She soon became vice president of marketing and product development.

“I learned then that taking chances, taking risks, is worth it in the end even when you don’t win them all,” she says.

Carter-Miller, who grew up on Chicago’s South Side, credits both her family and her community for her positive attitude and can-do mindset. Carter-Miller’s mother, Berneice Carter, took her and her sister, Kimberly,

to the theater and museums and surrounded them with books. Her father Joshua Carter, who had a college degree, worked as an executive in the government, one of the few places educated blacks could find meaningful work at that time. He often spoke of his work experiences at the dinner table.

“I grew up hearing that anything is possible and you can achieve your dreams,” says Carter-Miller.

Her South Side community nurtured this belief. Muhammed Ali was part of her neighborhood, as was Mahalia Jackson, America’s greatest gospel singer. The first black graduate of the University of Chicago MBA program lived a few doors down from Carter-Miller. He worked as a postman.

“In the segregated environment we lived in you could have everyone from the lowest rung of the economic ladder to the top because everyone lived in the same community,” says Carter-Miller. “Some people lived in nicer homes, but we had an opportunity to have role models around that were doing everything. I think that played into this idea that anything was possible.”

Although involved in civil rights, her parents were careful not to complain in front of their daughter about the limitations placed on them by segregation.

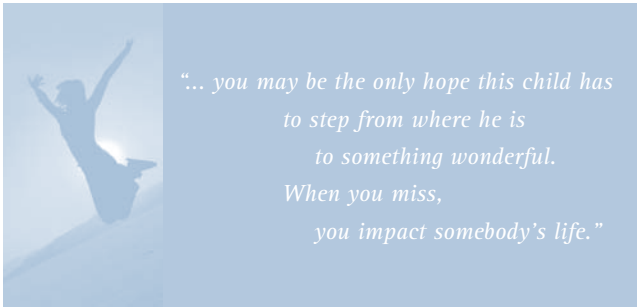
By 1999, Carter-Miller was corporate vice president and chief marketing officer for Motorola, Inc. She had achieved everything she set out to do. Along the way, she had gotten married to Edward Miller, whom she met in high school, and they had two daughters, Alexis (now 21) and Kimberly (now 15).

Following her career at Motorola, Inc., Carter-Miller became the executive vice president and chief marketing officer of Office Depot. But, in 2002 Carter-Miller left Office Depot and joined TechEdVentures, a company her husband established in 1998. Carter-Miller describes this as the toughest job she’s ever had. She loves it.

TechEdVentures has created charter schools and community-based programs in a disadvantaged community in Broward County, Florida. And, although her title is president, Carter-Miller’s job is to help young students and educators internalize the message that, “anything is possible if you follow your dream.”

Of course, it is only possible to follow a dream if you have one. That is what TechEdVentures has done; through various programs it has given young students the stuff that dreams are made of.

The charter school program, which began with Smart School Charter Middle School and grew to include a second middle school, a career academy high school and several community programs, strongly focuses on computers and technology. Its ultimate goal is to prepare each student academically and financially to go to college or to work in a meaningful job with a living wage. TechEdVentures prepares students in all kinds of ways, from in-class lessons to after-school activities and field trips. Each year, for example, students go on a college tour. Last



year they went to schools in Florida and Georgia. Students met several college presidents and stayed in the dorms. Many of these kids have never left their neighborhood, much less visited a college campus, notes Carter-Miller.

TechEdventures programs, which are first come, first served, reach well over 1,000 students and have been a success by any measure. The first middle school, for example, is one of only two "A" rated schools in the community. The other is a magnet school to which students must apply.

"No one, not even their families, could ever believe these kids could achieve this," says Carter-Miller. "But Edward and I, along with our talented educators, knew they could. TechEdventures has changed the consciousness of the community."

By 2002 Carter-Miller saw that TechEdventures could use the kind of business expertise she had.

"I decided I could keep doing corporate work or I could do something really meaningful and impact lives," says Carter-Miller.

"In a corporation, you're trying to hit sales and profit targets," she says. "When you hit them, everything's great; stock goes up, everyone gets bonuses, stock holders are happy. If you miss, oh well, you try again next quarter."

"In this environment, on the other hand, you may be the only chance a kid has. Their parents may be incarcerated, they may be living with their grandparents, and you may be the only hope this child has to step from where he is to something wonderful. When you miss, you impact somebody's life."

Carter-Miller infuses students with her "anything is possible" attitude every chance she gets. She tells of a student who had excellent standardized test scores, but had never seen himself as college material. Carter-Miller sat him down, told him about the advantages of a college degree and painted a picture for him of a different kind of life. It was the first time anyone had ever done that for him.

So these days, although the vehicle is different from what she once imagined, Carter-Miller is, indeed, making the world a better place, one child at a time.

"Anything is possible if you follow your dreams," she reminds them.

TOM SLEEMAN LEADING WITH INTEGRITY

Tom Sleeman and his wife Nancy have pledged \$500,000 to endow a program in leadership training for undergraduate students at the College of Business. The program will start this academic year with a limited number of students and gradually expand until it is serving up to 100 students a year.

"The motivation for this gift is my feeling that it's important for the College of Business to teach leadership, particularly business leadership with integrity," said Sleeman, '54 accountant, who retired in 1994 as the chief financial officer for Unocal, a major oil and chemical company. "I want to make sure future business leaders know how to lead, but I also want to make sure they lead in the right direction."

"As students, they need to understand that it's important that they behave with integrity in everything they do. They have to understand that they will be put to the test, and they have to know how to deal with it."

"I'm not sure why, but I think the need for training in ethics is greater than it once was. Some of the things that have happened in the last few years have certainly shown that there is the need for people to understand business ethics. From the time I started my career, until I finished it, I didn't observe the kinds of things that I've observed in the last few years."

Sleeman also wants future business leaders to be capable of functioning in a global arena where the people with whom they work may have different cultural and ethical values than their own. "I think it's obvious that the business world gets more complicated all the time," he said. "It's a multi-national business system now. Business leaders have to understand the intricacies of leading many different kinds of people."

The leadership program will serve honor students, as well as other students who show leadership potential. Initially, the training will include an overnight off-campus seminar in which students may simulate ethical dilemmas or other situations they could encounter in their careers. Later, the program will include an annual leadership conference organized by seniors who have already completed earlier facets of leadership training.

Sleeman began his career as an accounting trainee with the Pure Oil Co. of Chicago. Pure Oil was absorbed into what later became Unocal, which in turn became part of Chevron last year. As he moved through the ranks, Sleeman served as president of both Unocal's mining subsidiary and its chemical division, and as the chief financial officer and director of the parent company. Nancy Sleeman had a career as an administrator in a California retirement community.

Sleeman has previously made a number of gifts to the University of Illinois, including the endowed Robert K. Mautz Honorary Scholarship for accountancy students in the College of Business. Also, a joint gift from Sleeman and his late wife June Netzel Sleeman, who died in 1999, created the Joe Sutton Honorary Scholarship in Print Journalism in the College of Communications. June Sleeman was a 1954 journalism graduate. In 2006, Sleeman created the Tom and June Netzel Sleeman Professorship in Business Journalism at the College of Communications. ■

LESLIE GRAYSON
RIGHT PLACE, RIGHT TIME

Leslie Grayson knows a bit about being in the right place at the right time. In her mid-20s, Grayson answered a newspaper ad looking for customer service representatives. Now group vice president of operations for the national division at Time Warner Cable, she started her career in the industry answering telephones. Within a month she was promoted to manager and it's been a steady climb up the corporate ladder ever since.

Having worked for more mature companies like Xerox and American Express, Grayson, who majored in business at the University of Denver, appreciated working for a young, fast-growing company, where the opportunities were far greater.

"I feel blessed that I've had the opportunity to work for an absolutely awesome company," she says. "It's an industry that's very fast paced. It's constantly going through change. I think there's just about anything you'd want in your career you can find at Time Warner."

The opportunity to earn her MBA was another example of "right time, right place." After working seven years for Time Warner Cable in Colorado, Grayson took a position "in the field," with a struggling unit in Champaign-Urbana. Although her day job was hard enough—"trial by fire" she calls it—Grayson was determined to earn an MBA. Luckily, she discovered the Illinois Executive MBA program, which held classes on the weekends.

"The MBA program was one of the most exciting times of my life," says Grayson, who received her degree in 1993. "I look back and see it was one of the best things I could have done. I absolutely love an academic environment and in the Executive MBA program everyone was there for the same goal—to advance their learning."

The program attracted people, like Grayson, who were working adults in high-profile, challenging jobs.

"The program really helped me step away and think about my own organization from a distance," says Grayson. "I also took issues I faced at work and brought them to the program as an opportunity to roleplay the resolution in a safe environment. I used the program like a mini thinktank. It was a wonderful environment where there were not a lot of distractions and there was a significant amount of collaboration."

As a vice president in the national division, Grayson is now responsible for numerous small to mid-size markets from Kentucky to Kansas. Each of these markets, which together serve about 200,000 customers, has its own P&L responsibilities, technical operations, business management, community affairs and marketing issues.

Grayson is the highest-ranking African-American woman in all of Time Warner Cable and, although proud of her accomplishments, she feels more could be done to attract women, of all kinds, into the corporate structure.

"The company looks to operate in a manner that represents the markets we serve and it values diversity. Having said that, the question is, have we done enough? I don't think so because we are not as well represented in terms of women or people of color as we could be at the executive levels. That is just another challenge we face."

Grayson, who credits her friends and family with helping to keep her grounded, doesn't let success go to her head. After all, she says, "when I think about coming to work for Time Warner as an entry-level customer service representative, I thought my life was good then!" ■

Keeping Hijabs Soft and Galabiyas Looking Fresh

Alumnus Manages Downy, Lenor Brands for Procter and Gamble in Europe, the Middle East, and Africa

It might be a stretch to say that Allan Peretz is responsible for half of the dirty laundry in the world. But as the Regional Brand Manager for Fabric Softeners at Procter and Gamble, he does help consumers in Central and Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and Africa keep their headscarves, tunics, dresses, trousers, and other articles of clothing soft and fresh.

A Canadian by birth, Peretz attended high school in Illinois, then joined the U.S. Army. He was deployed to Saudi Arabia and Iraq in the Gulf War, and when he returned to the United States, completed an undergraduate accounting degree. He came to the University of Illinois in 1997 to pursue his MBA, and joined Procter and Gamble shortly after he graduated in 1999. He is currently based in Brussels, Belgium, though he travels extensively to research consumer behavior, visit local markets, and develop strategies with team members throughout the region.

Managing the Downy and Lenor brands means that Peretz conducts extensive in-home consumer research, something he finds helpful in putting consumers at ease and learning more about their routines.

"It's been personally enlightening to meet and speak with the region's consumers, especially in societies such as Saudi Arabia or Russia, where culture and norms are very different than what I am used to as a North American."

He has also found that consumer motivation for purchasing a specific brand is surprisingly similar across the region, despite huge differences in average consumer income (\$2,000 per year in Pakistan vs. \$17,000 per year in Israel) and the shopping environments (sophisticated megamarkets run by global corporations vs. open air markets run by individual vendors).

"It's training me to rely on my gut," he said. "The types of data and market understanding available in the United States just are not available here, and the high pace of competition in the region, driven by an array of global, regional, and local competitors, requires faster decisions and execution."

Peretz cites his MBA training for helping him make those decisions. "The program consistently reinforced that being a business leader is both about excellent strategy and execution," he said. "For better or worse, what I do in this assignment has a very quick and measurable impact. Seeing the impact of my brands' strategies play out so quickly is enormously satisfying."

Peretz and his family have also found living in Europe enormously satisfying, even if it's meant downsizing from a vehicle with four wheels to one with two wheels.

"Mopeds are very popular here and cut down on drive time significantly," he said. "I bought a BMW C1 scooter, which is either the ultimate "nerdmobile" or the iPod of urban mobility—I can't decide." ■

STATE FARM EXPANDS PARTNERSHIP WITH COLLEGE

INVESTMENT SUPPORTS NEW CLASSROOM SPACE

State Farm and the State Farm Companies Foundation have pledged \$500,000 to support the College's \$75 million fund-raising initiative, *Investing in Excellence*. The gift, to be made over five years, will fund classroom space in the new Business Instructional Facility.

The State Farm Companies Foundation supports efforts of excellence in higher education throughout central Illinois and the nation. "Our support of the University of Illinois' Business Instructional Facility is a serious response to a workforce issue. The Foundation is pleased to assist the U of I College of Business as it prepares and educates our future labor force," said Mike Fernandez, Vice President, State Farm Corporate Communications and External Relations.

"This is a significant investment in the College," said Dean Avijit Ghosh. "We are excited by and proud of our partnership with State Farm. The firm's involvement in the Insurance and Risk Management Program and the Research Park has benefited our programs, our students, our faculty, and the firm."

Stephen D'Arcy, the John C. Brogan Faculty Scholar in Risk Management and a professor of finance in the College of Business, echoed those sentiments.

"Clearly, this partnership will benefit both the corporate partners and the University," he said. "In today's fast-changing business environment, risk managers and insurers need to have access to quality, independent research on the major issues they face. Such research can be essential both for making appropriate decisions and for citing as authoritative work in regulatory and court hearings. By creating a partnership between industry and the University, corporate partners can direct research on the most critical issues they are facing, participate in the research process by providing their expertise, and have initial access to the results of the research programs."

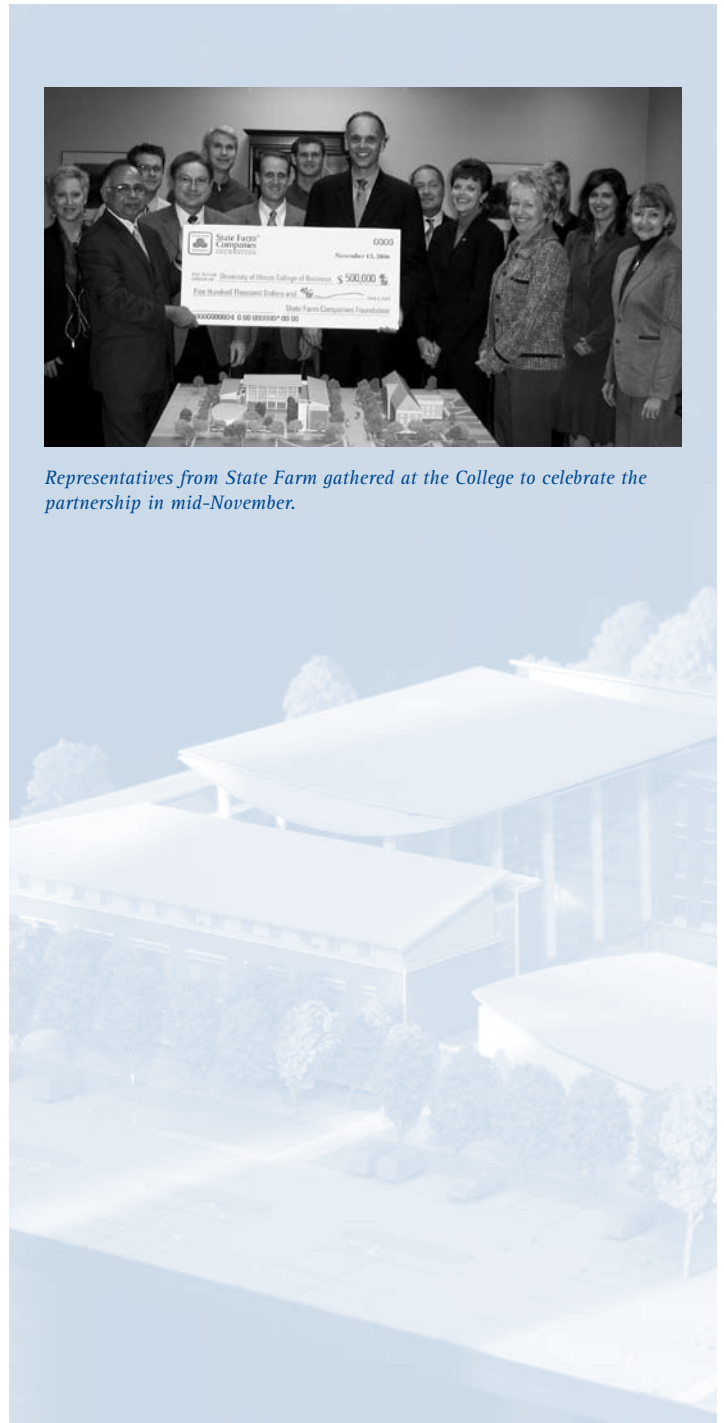
State Farm partners, College leaders, and more than 50 students celebrated the gift at a reception in Champaign in mid-November. College representatives thanked State Farm for its longstanding partnership with the College, while students inspected the building model and learned more about what to expect when the building opens for classes in Fall 2008.

The State Farm gift is particularly important to the College because it supports classroom space—a premium commodity on campus. The new facility will provide 160,000+ square feet of space to accommodate 18 state-of-the-art classrooms, career development and academic counseling centers, student program offices, a recruitment suite, a 300-seat auditorium, and space for students to meet and study.

"The facility is intended to enrich the student experience at Illinois," Ghosh said. "This gift directly influences the quality of our programs. We're delighted that State Farm is supporting this fundamental aspect of business education." ■

VENTURE CAPITAL COMPETITION NETS STUDENTS \$2,000 PRIZE

The world of venture capitalism is highly competitive. Every year, analysts at venture funds screen hundreds of investment proposals to find just the right ones for their firms. And once identified, the analysts must defend their choices in competition for the scarce partnership resources of time and money. When they pitch a proposed deal to their partners, they must know their subject inside and out—and they must be ready for tough questions.

A competition sponsored by the Golder Center in the College of Business, and with the generous support of IllinoisVentures seeks to mimic that world and prepare undergraduates to respond to these challenges. In mid-November, nine student team finalists participated in a venture capital competition with a top prize of \$2,000. Their challenge? Convince their “Senior Partners” that a proposed investment was worthwhile. Teams were given a week to analyze the business plan of their subject, a specialty toy retailer selling only on the Internet and promoting an online parents’ community. They then developed an investment thesis and proposal and made their argument to the panel of judges.

The judges, including senior VC’s from IllinoisVentures, Arch Development, and Ceres Venture Fund, played the role of the senior partners and grilled the teams with tough questions on the proposed investment. “What due diligence will you perform?” “How will you avoid cash burnout in the first few months?” “What if it takes twice as long and costs twice as much?” “Who is the competition, really, and what will be your positioning?” The students had to think quickly on their feet, and while there were only three winning teams out of the nine finalists, organizer Dan O’Connell said it was valuable experience for every one of them.

“I am delighted to have you all here,” O’Connell, director of the Golder Center, said just before he announced the winners. “I know it’s a real learning experience for each of you to be put through the ringer and to come out shining. Also, I get to show off our incredible student talent to professionals such as our judges here. I cannot emphasize how incredibly difficult it was to pick the top three winners from the high caliber of work demonstrated here today.”

In its second year, the Venture Competition has grown from just three teams to the nine who competed this year. While venture capital competitions are currently held for graduate students at universities around the country, the College is unique in that its competition is meant specifically for undergraduate students.

“As far as I know, this is the only competition of its kind meant for undergraduates and is very similar in terms of the analysis and deliverables required in the graduate competitions held around the country,” said O’Connell.

In preparation for the competition, students attended a series of workshops to introduce the workings of a venture firm and to polish their analytical and presentation skills. They were ultimately judged on the strength of their investment argument and the depth of their understanding of some very complex issues. Three teams came out on top.

First place and \$2,000 went to Team Triple Threat, sophomore Alina Gunko, senior Jennifer Hwang, and junior Andrew Rawlings. Team Local Celebrities, seniors Dan Wallenberg, Dave Hoffer, Dave Sekowski and Amy Matsuhashi, took second place with winnings of \$1,250, while last year’s winners, Team Juggernaut, finished third. Seniors Tim Bosslet, Casey Lindbeck, and, Sebastian Rymarz, and juniors Eric Nichols and Ryan Hoffman will split a \$750 prize.

“Look out for the next competition which will be held this spring,” O’Connell said. ■

AARON ARTH
"THE FOUNDATION TO SUCCEED"

It's been ten years since Aaron Arth '96 attended classes at the University of Illinois. But it's probably been about ten minutes since he's used the skills he acquired here. "College gives you a foundation of knowledge. It gives you a base. Then you learn how to apply that knowledge to each unique situation," he said.

Arth, who is now a vice president with Goldman, Sachs & Co. (where he has been since graduation) in New York, wanted to study finance when he enrolled in the College of Business. It would prove to be a wise choice. He has found his niche in an industry that requires strong analytical skills and a commitment to client service. "Over the years at Goldman Sachs, I've worked to develop trusted relationships with my clients. I'm proud of that."

Those relationships don't stop with his clients, though. Arth has maintained strong ties to the College, visiting classes, mentoring students, and helping support the new Business Instructional Facility. He is younger than many typical donors, but says that he enjoys giving back because, like many supporters of the University, he wants to help ensure that current students have access to the same resources and experiences that have contributed to his success.

"Absent the professors, the classes, the mentors, the resources which the University provided for me, I wouldn't be here today. The University gave me the foundation to succeed. At a young age, usually you can give more time than money. I feel fortunate that I can give to the University in various ways at this point in my life," he said.

Arth is also a hard-core Illini fan, and helps support student athletes with gifts to the I Fund, as well. Contributing to athletics is another way of showing his Illinois pride. "I give more to the College, but they (education and athletics) work together to make a great institution. It brings back all the old memories. It's a great way to stay in touch." ■

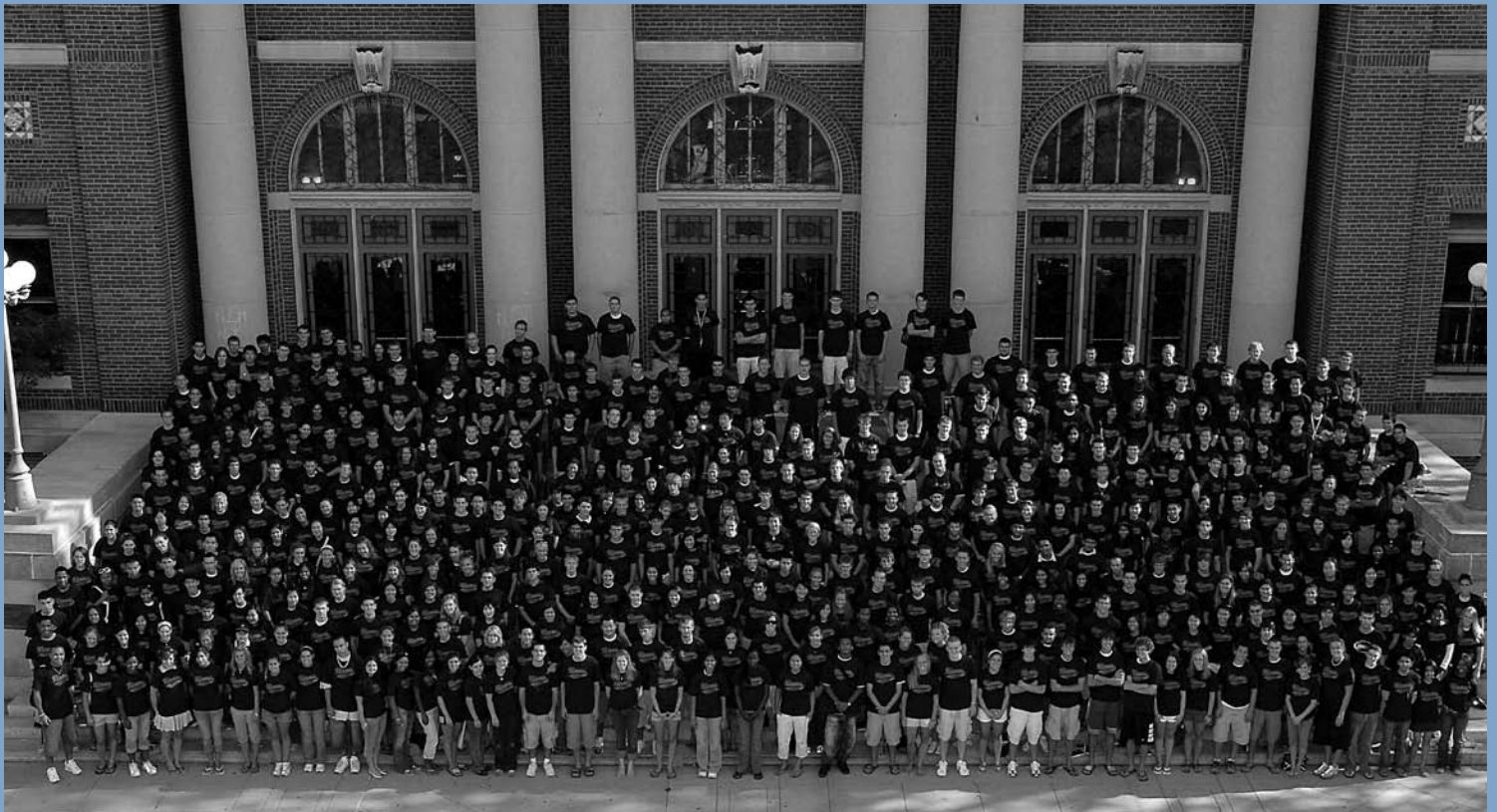
