Candidates should expect to have completed their doctoral degree by Spring 2019. We seek candidates with an expertise in International Business, who can interact with the 'Strategy, Entrepreneurship & International Business' area faculty within the Department of Business Administration, and who have the willingness and ability to teach a class in Global Supply Chain Management. Salary is competitive.
